TEN REASONS TO SPECIFY A SPRA CONTRACTOR

CONSTRUCTION STAGE		MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS AND FEATURES
1	CONCEPT	Must conform to the SPRA Code of Practice for design and installation.
2	DESIGN	Must be a member of at least one SSIP-registered certification body.
3	SPECIFICATION	SPRA provides technical support to its members.
4	TENDERING	Must provide recognised training to technical staff.
5	INSTALLATION	Must keep training records for third party inspection.
6		Must be working towards NVQ assessment of workforce.
7		Must be properly insured.
8		Dual site inspection by contractor and manufacturer.
9	SPECIFICATION	Must offer evidence of financial status.
10	REFUBISHMENT	Must design to SPRA Design Guide.
